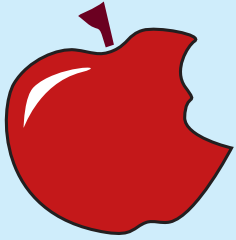


# A DAY IN THE LIFE OF A FAMILY

8:30 AM



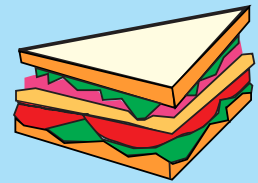
The children are greeted at school by our Success Coordinator, who arranges for tutoring sessions.

6:00 PM

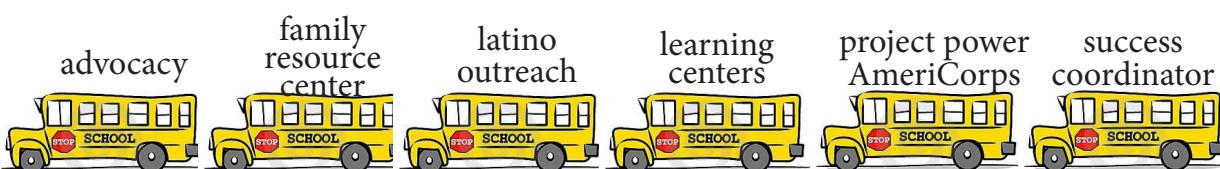


The family sits down to dinner supplemented by SNAP benefits, included in our Advocacy work.
